Family Planning:

These services enable individuals (minors included) to make informed decisions regarding contraceptive usage. Medical services include diagnosis, treatment of gynecologic related problems, lab tests, drug supplies and related counseling. It includes voluntary sterilization in accordance with Federal regulations.

The program's fee system is based on evaluation of income/sliding scale. The clinic staff includes physicians, nurse practitioners, and nursing/clerical. Client population is not restricted to Bell County.

Prenatal:

The clinic provides an initial exam, lab work, and subsequent medical visits throughout pregnancy. The client arranges delivery services at a local facility. The cost of additional lab/services required in the clinic will be assumed by the patient. Complicated obstetric services are referred to Scott & White hospital. Fees are based on sliding scale/Medicaid acceptance. The clinics are staffed by OB/GYN residents from Scott & White. The clients must reside in Bell County.

Sexually Transmitted Diseases:

An STD clinic provides diagnostic and treatment services for priority diseases; those targeted for disease intervention include syphilis, gonorrhea, chlamydia, and chancroid. Includes confidential counseling/testing for HIV (no charge). Referral mechanism in place for HIV early intervention services and relevant health services. Administrative fee for STD clinic is \$20.00, however, no one is refused services if demonstrates inability to pay.

Tuberculosis:

Any individual in need of Tuberculosis screening, diagnosis, treatment, contacts to TB cases, and those having positive skin tests who meet established guidelines are eligible for services. Services include skin test, x-ray, sputum cultures, medical evaluation and medications. There is no residence requirement or financial guidelines. Patients may be referred by other agencies, private physicians, or come in voluntarily. Determination of eligibility will be made at the time patient makes initial contact or within 2-3 days. Normally there is no charge for a skin test, x-ray, physician visit, or medication. There is a \$15.00 fee for individuals desiring TB skin tests for school or employment, who are not contacts to actual TB cases or TB suspects.
